Safety on the Internet

ALWAYS be cautious when you search - you can sometimes get results you didn't expect!

REPORT anything you think is unsafe.

NEVER give out your name or details about you to people you don't know online.

REMEMBER, you can't 'un-see' something that has upset you - talk to someone about it.

If you have any concerns, talk to a member of staff in school

Site Safety at school is important for EVERYONE. Stick to these rules...

Never open a gate for a stranger.

If you see a gate open - close it!

If a stranger asks you to open a door, politely tell them that you are not allowed.

If someone is walking around the school unsupervised and you don't know them, they should be wearing a Visitors

Badge - if they're not, tell a member of staff immediately!
